SOWER CHURCH SENDS OUT CHURCH PLANTING COUPLE

For the first time in the church's history, Sower Church in Lincoln is sending out a couple to plant a church. Pastor Mike Whitney has led the thirty-eight-year-old church for the past ten years. Under his leadership, the church has grown, bought, and remodeled a building, changed its name, merged with a sister church, and intentionally equipped leaders for the harvest. The first fruits of that labor are Derek and Shannon Rempe who will be moving to Highland, Kansas.

Derek came to Christ through a collegiate ministry at Kansas University led by Dan Coke who is now on staff at Sower. The Rempes met at KU, where Shannon was on the swim team. After graduation, they followed Dan to Lincoln where they worked in a collegiate based church plant that later merged with Sower church. With their son and a new baby on the way, the Rempes will be partnering with NorthRidge Church. It is led by Network Pastor Charlie Robinson who has been with the church for almost thirty years—first as the youth pastor, then senior pastor, and now as the network pastor. Its vision is to "Reach and Equip People for Christ without Borders." The new plant in Highland will be NorthRidge's sixth location. The original church was in Sabetha, KS and now there are churches or new plants in Seneca, KS, as well as Falls City, Humboldt, and Peru, Nebraska.

Pastor Charlie gave the charge at the Sunday morning worship/commissioning services on March 27th. Using three primary passages, he commended the church's heart of compassion for Highland, a small community that needs a faithful gospel witness, and for their willingness to send out one of their best couples into the harvest field (Matthew 9:36-38). He spoke to the reality that every believer is gifted and called by God and should be willing to go when He calls (Isaiah 6:8). Pastor Charlie pointed out that the great commission calls us to prioritize making disciples, which simply means helping one another be more like Jesus (Matt 28:19-20). He closed by stating that this mission is the same for all of us: everyone, everywhere, all the time engaging others. He pointed out that being a Christian isn't a one-day a week event we attend, but a lifestyle we live day-by-day.

SPRING BREAK DESTINATION: OMAHA "BEACH?"



Usually, the phrase college spring break is associated with the name of some beach in Florida or Texas. For a group of college students from Oklahoma, it meant a trip to Omaha—but it sure wasn't close to any beach. Baptist Collegiate Ministry (BCM) Director Jay Kindsvater who serves at Redlands Community College in El Reno and Oklahoma State University at Oklahoma City brought his third different spring break college mission team to the Omaha area. The last time was in 2019 when they had the privilege of doing some extra driving as we had plenty of water in the Omaha area, but still no beaches.

The team arrived late Thursday night and did prep work in the morning and passed out flyers in the community in the afternoon for a children's outreach event to be held at the Omaha Baptist Center. The Saturday outreach event supported the work of two churches (Faithful Hearts and Christ Foundation) and a ministry (Freeway) that utilize the facility. Jay enlisted the help of Dale Phillips of CareActor Ministries out of Hastings who does Christian dramatic monologues. The event wrapped up with lunch the students prepared for everyone.

They shifted to the Heartland Church Network building later in the day to serve with Freeway Ministries led by Rick and Sherri Lechner during their weekly outreach event. Sunday morning they worshipped with Pastor Shane Lester and Renewed Hope and in the afternoon they joined Pastor James Guek at First Evangelical as both churches use the HCN building where the team also staved.

Then on Monday and Tuesday, they worked with Tanner Devereaux who serves as HCN's property manager and as a church planter intern for Way Maker Church at the HCN office building. There, the team helped paint in the preschool and children's rooms that are being renovated and then did tree and brush clean-up on the property. On Wednesday, they relaxed at Omaha's famous Henry Doorly Zoo before they headed back to Oklahoma on Thursday morning—a busy week!

As Jay reflected on the week he asked, "When's the last time you read Isaiah 9:2-7? Maybe you will need Handel's Messiah playing in the background in order to get just how wonderful Jesus is:

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Those who dwelt in the land of the shadow of death, upon them a light has shined. You have multiplied the nation and increased its joy; They rejoice before You according to the joy of harvest, as men rejoice when they divide the spoil. For You have broken the yoke of his burden and the staff of his shoulder, the rod of his oppressor, as in the day of Midian. For every warrior's sandal from the noisy battle, and garments rolled in blood, ill be used for burning and fuel of fire. Rev. T. Michael Williams Installed as 27th Pastor of Historic Mt. Moriah Baptist Church

On Sunday, April 3rd, the sanctuary of Mt. Moriah Baptist Church was filled with members and well-wishers, as Rev. T. Michael Williams was installed as the 27th pastor of Mt. Moriah Baptist Church in Omaha. The historic church has ministered to the community for over 135 years. Pastor T. Michael served as the Evangelism and NextGen Pastor of Mt. Moriah from January 1, 2019, through December 31, 2021, before he began serving as pastor. Rev. Williams had previously led Risen Son Baptist Church BGC of Omaha for thirty years. In collaboration with Rev. Dr. Ralph Lassiter, who stepped into the Pastor Emeritus role at Mt. Moriah on January 1, Pastor Williams led Risen Son to merge with Mt. Moriah with the churches retaining the name and location of Mt. Moriah.

T. Michael is a native of Albuquerque, New Mexico, where he grew up attending Mt. Olive Baptist Church with his family, and was influenced by his Uncle James who served as pastor of Antioch Baptist Church. When T. Michael shared with his uncle the sense of God's calling to serve as a pastor, the advice he received was, "It's a suffering way" reflective of the role of an under-shepherd who is also willing to be a suffering servant. After moving to Omaha in 1986, Pastor Williams earned an undergraduate degree in Bible and Pastoral Ministries and a Master's in Biblical Studies from Grace University.

He is married to Omaha native Cheryl D. (Jones) Williams. Sister Cheryl graduated from Omaha Central High School, holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Nebraska at Omaha, and a Master's Degree from Bellevue University. Having worked in the banking industry, she now serves as an IT Quality expert for one of the nation's largest logistics and transportation companies. Sister Williams is passionate about shaping the next generation of children and youth.

Rev. Williams shares his wife's concern for the next generation, as he served on the board of Child Evangelism Fellowship for 25 years, ten years as chairman, and twenty-two years in leadership at summer Bible camps. Pastor T. Michael has been very active in the community.

He has served on the Southeast Area Police Advisory Board, as a member of both the Omaha Public Schools Strategic Planning and the Bond Acquisition Committees, and as President of the Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance. Pastor Williams' community service was recognized when he was presented the 2016 MLK Jr. Drum Major Award from Creighton University. His years of faithfulness also opened the door to his recent election as the President of the Omaha branch of the NAACP

The installation preacher for the service was Pastor Dwayne Hawkins, President of the New Era Baptist State Convention of Nebraska and Pastor of Antioch Baptist Church of Omaha. Words of Encouragement were extended by Rev. Aaron Householder the Associational Mission Strategist for the Heartland Church Network. The Installation Officiant for the service was Pastor Kenneth Allen of Zion Baptist Church. The Charge to the Church was given by Pastor Brian Page of Pleasant Green Baptist Church, and the Charge to the Pastor was given by Pastor Cedric Perkins of Pilgrim Baptist Church.

The installation prayer was led by Rev. Dr. Ralph Lassiter after all ministers present came forward and laid hands on Pastor Williams. Sister Carol Hooks, President of the Baptist Minister's Wives Council of Nebraska, made a special presentation to Sister Cheryl Williams.

That was followed by special presentations to the couple from the Next Gen Ministry and Elders of Mt. Moriah, and Pastor Emeritus Ralph Lassiter presented Rev. T. Michael with a new leather binder for sermon notes and a new Five Translation Bible signed by all the ministers in attendance.

In Pastor Michael's closing remarks, he referenced the ministry theme verses of Dr. Lassiter, Proverbs 3:5-6, and then briefly discussed his, Ephesians 3:20-21: "Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us, to Him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Then Jay stated, "What I saw on our BCM mission trip reminded me He still is Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace that brings light to a dark world, joy in the harvest and He's still breaking the yoke of slavery!

On our mission trip I visited 3 growing wonderful churches: one where the youth led the service, one was with the people of South Sudan (they started 30ish minutes late and then went for 2 hours plus), and then a church with folks who knew what it was like to be homeless, living in the darkness of addictions and then meeting the Savior to walk in His light. We painted, did chainsaw work, ministered to the children, fed many, shared testimonies, worshipped with several, and all of us grew in Jesus! Thank you for your prayers. Thank you for the sweet fellowship that we have in Jesus. Thanks for the privilege to walk alongside of you as we were following Jesus."

Thank you Jay and your team for choosing Omaha's ministry field rather than a beach in balmy Texas or Florida. The Kingdom of God was blessed by your presence!
